Coming back to school!

Reminder that all children in Years I to 6 come back to school on Wednesday 4th September - classroom doors open at 8:45 a.m. with registration at 8:55 a.m.

Our new Reception children have their induction days on Wednesday, Thursday or Friday.

Nursery staff will be completing home visits this week for our new Nursery children.

Homework

We are aware that there are many different views regarding Homework—some parents/carers love it and want regular homework but we also recognise, that for some families, homework can be a cause of stress in the home. Therefore, we are trying to find a solution which will hopefully be appropriate for everyone!

Each week, the children will receive the following:

- Reading: read your child's book as much as possible; practise sounds, green words, red words, share a story, ask questions
- Spelling: List of words provided each week for children to learn and be tested on
- Maths: Each week, your child will receive a task questions based on fluency. Answers will be posted on Teams.

School Uniform and PE Kit

Is your child wearing the correct uniform and PE Kit? School jumpers/sweatshirts/cardigans are Navy Blue (not black). Letters will be going home to those parents who are not supporting our uniform policy.

School Dinners & Snack—Important changes for 2024/25!

School Meals for Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 children continue to be FREE! However, we still need parents to claim for Free School Meals as this is important for our Pupil Premium Funding.

For children in Year 3 to Year 6, school dinners must be paid for unless you are entitled to Free School Meals.

For those that need to pay, charges for School Meals have increased to:

- £14.00 per week (£2.80 per day)
- £9.00 per week (£1.80 per day) Flexible Charging (please see below for information)

Flexible Charging Scheme

We are continuing to offer the Flexible Charging Scheme for those parents/carers who qualify. This is for parents/carers who narrowly miss the threshold for Free School Meals. Please contact school for more information or to check to see if you are eligible.

Children's morning snack

In addition to bagels and fruit, which we subsidise the cost of, we also sell a range of snack items such as yoghurts, breakfast bars and raisins. The cost of snack is:

- £13.00 per term when paid as a single payment
- £1.50 if paid weekly (to be paid on Mondays only)



How to activate your account

1. Download the Android or iPhone app.





- Press 'Sign Up' then enter the email and mobile number your school has on record.
 If you're not sure if they have the right details, it's best to check and update first.
- Press 'Send PIN'. You will receive a text message with your unique PIN.
- 4. You're now ready to log in and start using School Gateway.

Children are required to be in their classrooms between 8:45 - 8:55 a.m.
