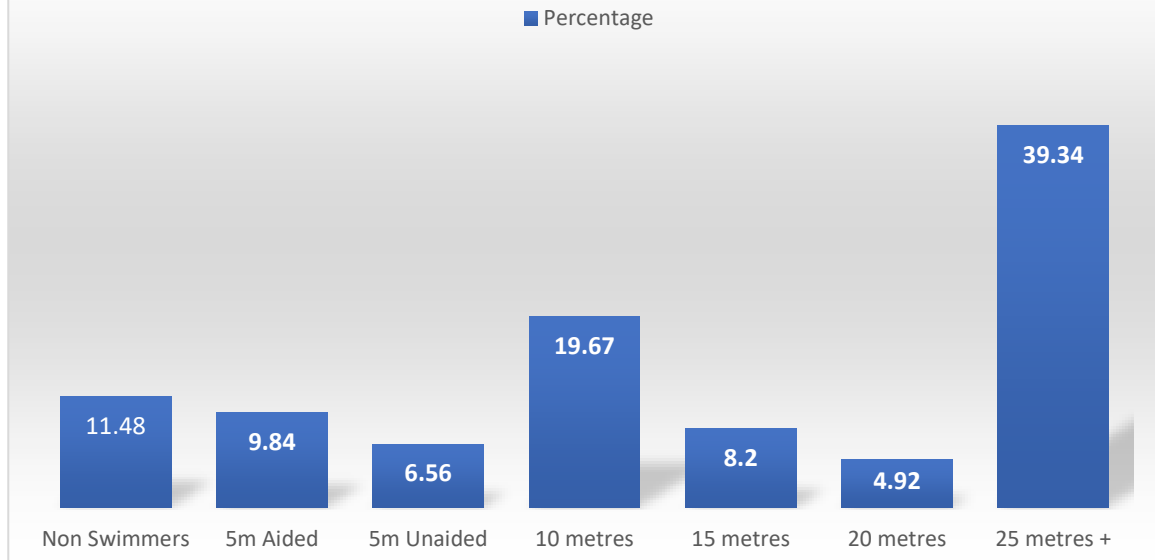




St Luke's Primary School Swimming Data Year 6 2023-2024

Meeting National Requirements for swimming and water safety	Percentage July 2024
What percentage of your current Year 6 cohort swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres?	39.34%
What percentage of your current Year 6 cohort use a range of strokes effectively [for example, front crawl, backstroke and breaststroke]?	48%
What percentage of your current Year 6 cohort perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations?	83%
